Advocacy Day in Albany NY, sponsored by the New York Library Association (NYLA) on **Tuesday, February 25**. The purpose is to help the legislators understand how much people care about libraries by packing their offices with advocates at every scheduled appointment. With 11 legislators to visit, many people are needed to come and show



their support. RCLS makes all the appointments, supplies the talking points and arranges transportation (see below) – you just bring your passion for libraries!

Your attendance can make a BIG impact. Join other advocates for meetings with your NYS representatives to discuss increasing Statewide Library Aid to \$200M and funding Library Capital Infrastructure improvements at \$75M.

Governor Cuomo will soon release his Executive Budget. If it is simular to previous years' budgets, it will include cuts to both State Library Aid and State Aid for Public Library Construction.

Approximately 70 grants, up to \$500 each, will be awarded to teachers and librarians in public schools and libraries whose proposals reflect imagination and a desire to make learning fun. The Foundation welcomes Mini-Grant proposals focusing on any subject. Decisions will be e-mailed to all applicants in May. #### ALSC's Bookapalooza Program

ALA's Association for Library Services to Children's annual <u>Bookapalooza Program</u> selects three libraries to receive a collection of materials to help transform their collection, provide the opportunity for these materials to be used in their community in creative and innovative ways, and enhance their library service to children and families. Applicants must be personal members of ALSC and ALA.

Each year the ALSC office receives almost 3,000 newly published books, videos, audio books, and recordings from children's trade publishers. The materials are primarily for children ages birth through fourteen and are submitted to ALSC award and media evaluation selection committees for award and notables consideration. The Bookapalooza Program was created to find new homes for these materials.

#### PLA's Inclusive Internship Initiative

Want to mentor a paid high school intern at your library? The Public Library Association's <u>Inclusive Internship Initiative</u> (III) will sponsor 50 paid, summer internships for high school junior and senior students at their local public library as a pathway program to increase diversity in public librarianship. Students from diverse backgrounds are recruited to be interns and introduced to careers in librarianship. Over the summer, each intern works with a library mentor on a community-based learning project. Library mentors practice leadership skills, and host libraries grow new audiences through outreach and programming. Grant funds will include an intern's stipend of \$3,500 and travel, hotel, and meal expenses for interns and mentors at two events: a June kick-off in Chicago and a closing event in Washington, DC in late September.

#### Update on the Macmillan ebook Embargo

AL: The Scoop, Dec. 31

Timothy Inklebarger writes, "Two months have passed since Macmillan Publishing began its restrictive embargo on ebooks, and the response by library advocates, by way of a public awareness campaign and efforts to influence state and federal lawmakers, appears to be gaining steam. More than 230,000 people have signed the #eBooksForAll online petition urging Macmillan to reverse its decision to limit a single copy per title to each public library for the first two months after its release. Advocates are making inroads at the congressional level—particularly with the House Judiciary Subcommittee on Antitrust, Commercial, and Administrative Law, which is currently investigating competition in digital markets."


